I was stunned to see an old lady hobble out of the cab. She paid the cabbie, sent him on his way, then asked if Mass was going to begin soon. My mind turned to some unholy thoughts – "Are you crazy, lady, to come out in this? Am I going to be your cabbie to take you back home? Will my life come to an end this evening on these treacherous roads with you?"

Well, something from above settled my mind and I gave consideration to the fact that this old lady braved the horrible elements to adore her Lord on His birthday. Besides, I thought, if I denied her Mass and ended up dying this morning, I would most assuredly go straight to hell.

So, we had midnight Mass together. In my short homily I told her ("Elsie") that God did this all for her. That made her happy. When she received Holy Communion you would have thought she saw the face of God Himself. I guess she did. The point of all the above is this: I hope all of us, after we receive Holy Communion will be able to say, in the quiet recesses of our soul, "just for me."

Anyhow, I got Elsie home, and myself safely back to the rectory. To date, that trip has been the greatest miracle in my life. When we think about it, Christmas does not have to be sweet, or perfect, or comfortable in order for it to be joyful. Thank the Lord for that.

# BISHOP'S MESSAGE FOR CHRISTMAS 2012

Dear Friends:

"I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary ...." We say these words Sunday after Sunday, and whenever we profess the Apostles' Creed.

Christmas is about Christ – His birth in Bethlehem, His encounter with the shepherds, with the Magi, and with Anna and Simeon – and our personal encounter with Him! During this Year of Faith, we reflect more intensely on that encounter, so that we might Rediscover the Joy of what it means for our lives.

A child – born for us! Life! Light! Joy! Peace! These are the images we treasure during this holy season. Yet, as He lies in the wooden manger, we can already foresee the impending suffering of the wood of the Cross with the senseless slaughter of the Holy Innocents to appease the vanity of Herod.
