

CHANGES TO KITCHENER'S GARBAGE COLLECTION PROGRAM

How will this affect St. Mark's Church?

As most of you know, starting March 6th, homes will be limited in the amount of garbage they can place at the curb for regional pickup.

While blue boxes and green boxes will continue to be picked up weekly, free garbage pick-up will now be limited to 4 bags every two weeks, with additional bags being charged a \$2 fee per bag. St. Mark's will be bound by these SAME restrictions.

Presumably this will present a challenge, especially when we are faced with larger events (like funerals, pancake suppers, etc.) where the amount of garbage produced is greatly increased.

Please watch the bulletin for information and education on changes we will be making as a parish in order to step up to this challenge.

For the most part this change will affect ALL of us, but with a little careful organization and everyone's co-operation, we can rewire the way we think about and deal with waste! *Stay tuned!*

Lenten Practices...

Ash Wednesday: A day of fasting and abstinence

On March 1, 2017, Ash Wednesday begins our season of Lent. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving in preparation for our celebrations of Easter, when Christ died and rose from the dead for our salvation. Ash Wednesday is also a day of fasting and abstinence. There are two days of compulsory fasting and abstinence prescribed by the Church: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (Code of Canon Law #1251).

FASTING means eating less than normal. We are asked to eat one regular size meal and two smaller meals. Catholics between the ages of 16-60 are asked abide by this discipline.

ABSTINENCE means abstaining from eating meat on this day.

Catholics older than 14 years of age are asked to abide by this discipline.

Note: We are also encouraged to continue the traditional practice of abstaining from meat every Friday. As well, one should not engage in excessive entertainment throughout the Lenten Season, and most certainly not on Good Friday.

Uh oh ... Lent is coming

Still a couple of weeks away, it is important for us to begin thinking of the meaning of the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of the Lord. It is a time to discipline ourselves through penance and sacrifice so that we may have the will to overcome sin in our lives. It is a time of great grace if one is willing to turn away from sin - all sin - not simply sin as we choose to see it. Rather, sin as carefully taught by the Church for two thousand years. The week prior to Lent I will put out an Examination of Conscience to help us examine our lives in the light of Christ. Our Lenten fasting calls us to remember that the kingdom of God is not founded on earthly success or glory or possessions. It is found when holiness abides, principally through fidelity to the Lord, charity and the practice of justice. More to come on this. Start thinking about coming to Mass during the week, making a good confession, and studying God's word and Catholic teaching. Just as our Lord's journey to the cross was rewarded by the resurrection, so too can this holy season be our dying to sin and rising in His Life. -- Fr. Don
