Famous Catholic Prayers (PART 2)

The Eucharist is truly, factually the body and blood, soul and divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Terms we use to describe the real presence are as follows: Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Host, Body and Blood, Bread of Life, Precious Blood. Note: We <u>never</u> refer to the Eucharist from the cup as 'wine', for wine it is no longer at the point of the consecration onward.

Did you ever wonder how the Lord in the Eucharist can be present in millions of tabernacles and be received by millions of Catholics all at the same time? The reason for this is that we now receive at the altar His risen and glorified presence, unlimited by time and space as was the former body of our Lord when he walked on this earth. For this reason, during the distribution of Holy Communion, we say "The Body of Christ" (not of Jesus). The term 'Christ' implies His glorified and unlimited way of being present. This distinction helps us to know how it is that Jesus can be so universally present to everyone, everywhere.

Here is an old prayer that we can say after Communion, in the chapel, or during any other Eucharistic moment:

O Sacrament most Holy!
O Sacrament Divine!
All praise and all thanksgiving
Be every moment Thine.
