The young couple, family and friends awaited the arrival of Fr. X to witness their wedding ceremony. He never showed up, and repeated attempts to locate another clergyman failed. There would be no wedding that day.

Cool-headed Uncle Charlie took the bull by the horns, "Folks, it's not the end of the world. We should pray for Father, who may be ill," (and a prayer was said). "Let's go to the hall (reception) and make the best of the situation." So all followed Charlie's instructions and, though the crowd was sullen and angry, they proceeded to the hall.

Just as the un-celebration was ready to break up, a priest showed up in response to Charlie's many S.O.S. calls. Since Charlie had the presence of mind to bring the marriage license to the hall, the vows were said, the documents signed and the now newlyweds could honeymoon in peace. The festivities, so I heard, took a definite upswing from then onward. And, from major panic, some faintings and a couple of minor heart attacks the day went remarkably well. And as a huge bonus, think of the great wedding stories that would be told for years to come – much more interesting than, "Wanna see our wedding pictures from Rockway Gardens?"

The hero of the day was old Charlie, who prayed, put things into perspective, and did several sensible and eventually very rewarding things. As a practicing Catholic he would have heard many times over the Lord's "peace be with you." For him, these words were more than mere sentiment or a filler phrase that Jesus used to get his sermons rolling. They are to bless us with the perspective that God is watching over us, an awareness that can help a soul do great good especially when under pressure. – Fr. Don
