World Day of Grandparents & the Elderly FOURTH SUNDAY OF JULY

In January of this year, Pope Francis announced the establishment of a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The chosen day for the yearly celebration is the fourth Sunday of July, since it coincides with the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents.

Pope Francis reminds us about grandparents: "Their voice is precious because it sings the praises of God and safeguards the roots of peoples. They remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between generations, passing on the experience of life and faith to the young. Grandparents are often forgotten and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on."

This year, the first World Day celebration will take place on S unday, July 25 and at that Mass we will give special thanks to God for the gift of our grandparents and all the elderly.

New Film Invites Us to Really Know the Blessed Virgin Mary

Dr. Josephine Lombardi is a faculty member at St. Augustine's Seminary in Toronto. She recently released, "The First Lady and Her Successors," a film that explores the many ways that the Blessed Mother Mary can guide us today. She discussed this new film below.

All Christians know Mary of Nazareth is the mother of Jesus. Depending on their upbringing or catechetical background, Catholics and other Christians may not know a lot about her life or role in salvation history. The inspiration for the film was my desire for all people to know Mary of Nazareth with greater intimacy, using Scripture as the starting point.

The film is about the life of Mary, beginning with the Book of Genesis and ending with the Book of Revelation. We journey with Mary as we reflect on mysteries, events, words and actions associated with her earthly life. Accompanying us along the way, we have the stories of nine amazing women, sharing how their own life experiences help them understand and relate to Mary's journey.

The focus of the film is Mary in Sacred Scripture. Although Marian dogmas are implied throughout, the focus is the life of Mary as found in the Bible.

MARRIAGE TIPS:

- Listening may be the most important aspect of any relationship, but it is also the hardest part for us to get right! Listening requires our full attention, not just to the words spoken, but also to the emotions attached. Doing so allows us to understand how our spouse is feeling and, if we listen attentively, to repeat back what we are hearing. When we do this without first making a defensive reply, issues get resolved and our spouse feels supported. Then we can reverse roles, expressing our thoughts and feelings on the issue, as our spouse becomes the listener. Happy couples work on these skills until they become second nature, thus keeping their relationship bond strong. From: Family Ministry Office.
- → Marriages that have lasted over many years give gifts to future generations since they allow them to both look back and grow forward. Long-lasting marriages are a living example of what it means to have enduring love; they give hope. Marriage is at the heart of family, so celebrate your marriage milestones tell stories of the good times, the times you persevered and the joy of older love. These are important legacies to leave your children and grandchildren!

PARENTING TIPS:

- → COVID-19 continues to dominate and control much of our lives. All of this affects children, but since they take their cues from adults in their lives, we can help them to feel resilient. Remind them of how happy you are, despite all that is happening that you are together as a family. Remind them of the beauty of nature that is all around for them to see and enjoy, that technology lets them connect with other family and friends and that through all of this we can continue to pray and ask for God's blessings. When they hear anger and frustration, they feel worry and concern; when they hear optimism and calm, they too feel those emotions as well. Let us remind our children how much we love them; help keep them strong during the pandemic.
- → The summer is a good time to help your children reflect on the successes and challenges of the past school year. God provides every person with gifts to use in the world and it is good to remind your children that we are called to use our God-given gifts. Ask them to reflect on the gifts they see in themselves and share the gifts you see in them. Help them realize that they are indeed special and have good things to offer to others in their lives
