St. Barnabas, born Joseph, was an early Christian, one of the prominent Christian disciples in Jerusalem. He and Paul the Apostle undertook missionary journeys together and defended Gentile converts against the Judaizers. They traveled together making more converts, and participated in the Council of Jerusalem. Barnabas' story appears in the Acts of the Apostles, and Paul mentions him in some of his epistles. Clement of Alexandria and some scholars have ascribed the Epistle of Barnabas to him, but his authorship is disputed. Although the date, place, and circumstances of his death are historically unverifiable, Christian tradition holds that Barnabas was martyred at Salamis, Cyprus, in 61 AD. He is traditionally identified as the founder of the Cypriot Orthodox Church. Barnabas is usually identified as the cousin of Mark the Evangelist on the basis of Colossians 4. Some traditions hold that Aristobulus of Britannia, one of the Seventy Disciples, was the brother of Barnabas.

St. Anthony was born Fernando Martins in Lisbon, Portugal and died in 1231. Following his ordination to the priesthood, he joined the Franciscan Order and changed his name to Anthony. He eventually travelled to Morocco to spread God's truth, but became extremely sick and while recovering, spent much of his time in prayer and study. Noted by his contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church on 16 January 1946. He is also the patron saint of lost things, 'St. Anthony, please look around; something is lost and must be found.'

Today's Gospel (Mark 3:20–35)

In the section of the Gospel just before these verses, Jesus calls his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family.

A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. And the scribes think he is possessed by the devil. Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong man, Beelzebub, and overcomes him.

He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this. It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit.

Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood.

In the belief of our Roman Catholic faith, there are six sins that blaspheme against the Holy Spirit.

- 1. **Despair** (believing that one's evil is beyond God's forgiveness)
- 2. **Presumption** (glory without merit, that is, hope of salvation without keeping the Commandments, or expectation of pardon for sin without repentance)
- 3. Envying the goodness of another (sadness or repining at another's growth in virtue and perfection)
- 4. Obstinacy in sin (wilful persisting in wickedness, and running on from sin to sin, after sufficient instructions and admonition)
- 5. **Final impenitence** (to die without either confession or contrition for our sins)
- 6. **Impugning the known truth** (to argue against known points of faith, and this includes misrepresenting parts or all of the Christian faith to make it seem undesirable).
