11:30 am - Intentions of the Parishioners of St. Mark

St. Aloysius was born in Castiglione, Italy. The first words St. Aloysius spoke were the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. He was destined for the military by his father (who was in service to Philip II), but by the age of 9 Aloysius had decided on a religious life, and made a vow of perpetual virginity. To safeguard himself from possible temptation, he would keep his eyes persistently downcast in the presence of women. St. Charles Borromeo gave him his first Holy Communion. A kidney disease prevented St. Aloysius from a full social life for a while, so he spent his time in prayer and reading the lives of the saints. Although he was appointed a page in Spain, St. Aloysius kept up his many devotions and austerities, and was quite resolved to become a Jesuit. His family eventually moved back to Italy, where he taught catechism to the poor. When he was 18, he joined the Jesuits, after finally breaking down his father, who had refused his entrance into the order. He served in a hospital during the plague of 1587 in Milan, and died from it at the age of 23, after receiving the last rites from St. Robert Bellarmine. The last word he spoke was the Holy Name of Jesus.

Mastin as O Faranta This Mast

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary

Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.

Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all.

Visiting Missionary (JUNE 15/16)

Today we welcome **Brother Harley Mapes, OMI** (a Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate) to speak at all the Masses.

The Missionary Oblates were founded in 1816 by Saint Eugene de Mazenod who, moved by the collapse of the church after the French Revolution, was inspired to gather a group of men to minister to society's most abandoned. He instructed the Oblates to "teach people to be humans, and then Christian, and finally Saints!" Following in de Mazenod's footsteps, the Missionary Oblates minister in 71 countries around the world. Always, they search out those who are most abandoned by society and least touched by message of Jesus Christ. Canadian Oblates arrived in Kenya in 1997 and, while immersing themselves in the local language and culture, set about meeting the spiritual, educational and material needs of the people.

Brother Harley was for many years an educator in northern Canada, but has spent time ministering at Oblate missions in Asia and Africa. He will be sharing with us about his recent time in Kenya, inviting our parish to be inspired by the faith of the Kenyan people and moved to share with them in their need.
