Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist - Aside from the Lord and His Blessed Mother, John is the only other individual whose birth the Church commemorates with a solemnity. He is also only one of a few saints with two feasts. The second commemorates his beheading on August 29. Jesus called John the greatest of all those who had preceded him: "I tell you, among those born of women, no one is greater than John ... " John the Baptist was a contemporary of Christ who was known for evangelization and his baptizing of Jesus Christ. Through the Holy Spirit, he was the son of Zachariah and Elizabeth, who was otherwise too old to bear children. When Elizabeth was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leapt in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was to be the Son of God. John began public ministry around 30 AD and was known for attracting large crowds across the province of Judaea and around the Jordan River. When Jesus came to him to be baptized, John recognized him and said, "It is I who need baptism from you." Jesus told John to baptize Him anyway, which he did, whereupon the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God was seen like a dove. The voice of God spoke, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

# SOLEMNITY of the MOST HOLY BODY and BLOOD of CHRIST

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This feast originated in France in the mid-

thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This traditional date of the Feast is celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday, but in Canada, as in other parts of the world, it is celebrated on the following Sunday.

The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass calls our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist.

At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist: the Real Presence of Christ; body, blood, soul and divinity. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ, the people of God, as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

On The Feast of Corpus Christi, the Church calls us to faith in the real presence of Christ, not just a symbol, at every Mass under the appearance of bread and wine. St. Thomas Aquinas, the great theologian of the church, named this Transubstantiation. That is, while the elements of bread and wine retain their physical properties as bread and wine, their substance is transformed into the actual body and blood of Christ.

While, it is also true that God is truly present through his Spirit in other ways, such as through his Word and when two or three are gathered, God is present par excellence in the Eucharistic Body and Blood of His Son which we offer in sacrifice to the Father at every Mass as the one sacrifice offered on Good Friday. In the sacrificial meal of the Mass, our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others. As Catholics, the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith and the Mass central to our worship.

## FEAST of the SACRED HEART Friday, June 24 ~ Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m.

Followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and Devotions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Our Lord Jesus Christ appeared to St. Margaret Mary between 1673-1675. Among the words spoken to her, she heard Jesus make 12 promises to those who would respond to the pleading of His Heart and make an effort to return His love:

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their homes.
- 3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- 4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- 5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners will find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- 9. I will bless every place in which an image of My Heart is exposed and honored.
- 10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart.
- 12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in My disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.
