**St. Boniface** – The saint we know as Boniface was born around 680 in Devonshire, England and given the name Wynfrid. He was raised in Benedictine monasteries. By 717, he was a renowned teacher and preacher, but gave up his work in response to a call to the mission field of northern Netherlands. In Rome, Pope Gregory II re-named him Boniface. At Geismar, Boniface made a tremendous impression by destroying the great Oak of Thor, an object of pagan worship, without being harmed by 'the gods.' Boniface is called the "Apostle of Germany." On June 5, 754, he and 30 companions were killed by non-Christians.

# 9 DAY NOVENA FOR LIFE: June 1 - 9, 2019

St. Mark Knights of Columbus Council #9276 is promoting a 9-Day Novena for Life from June 1<sup>st</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The protection of life is a sustained prayer intention of the Church and in



particular of the Knights of Columbus. Knights remain firmly committed to defending the right to life of every human being from the moment of conception to natural death. **To participate in this novena, please pick up a novena prayer sheet from the narthex.**  **Today is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord**, when Jesus was taken to heaven on the 40th day after Easter. In Cycle C, our Gospel is taken from the conclusion of the Gospel of Luke.

There are similarities in the reports of Jesus' Ascension found in the Synoptic Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke. In each account, Jesus assigns his disciples the task of proclaiming the Gospel to the entire world. There are also notable distinctions. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, the disciples are sent by Jesus to baptize as well as to preach. In Luke's Gospel, however, this commission to baptize is absent. Instead, Jesus directs the disciples to return to Jerusalem to await the fulfillment of his promise to send them the Holy Spirit. Curiously, only Mark and Luke actually report Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Matthew's Gospel concludes with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples forever. Only the Gospel of Mark notes that Jesus ascended to sit at the right hand of God. In noting this, Mark teaches that Jesus' Ascension affirms the glory Jesus received from God after his death and Resurrection.

Those who believe in Jesus will be empowered to do what Jesus himself has done. Already in Mark's Gospel, during his ministry, Jesus sent his disciples out to preach, to heal, and to drive out unclean spirits. Now, they are sent again to do these things and more. From his place with God in heaven, Jesus helped his disciples, and he continues to help us as we try to live as his followers.

# **Visiting Missionary**

On the weekend of **June 15/16**, **Brother Harley Mapes, OMI** (a Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate) will be speaking at all the Masses.



The Missionary Oblates were founded in 1816 by Saint Eugene de Mazenod who, moved by the collapse of the church after the French Revolution, was inspired to gather a group of men to minister to society's most abandoned. He instructed the Oblates to "teach people to be humans, and then Christian, and finally Saints!"

Following in de Mazenod's footsteps, the Missionary Oblates minister in 71 countries around the world. Always, they search out those who are most abandoned by society and least touched by message of Jesus Christ. Canadian Oblates arrived in Kenya in 1997 and, while immersing themselves in the local language and culture, set about meeting the spiritual, educational and material needs of the people.

Brother Harley was for many years an educator in northern Canada, but has spent time ministering at Oblate missions in Asia and Africa.
