Dear Parishioners,

VISITING THE SICK

I am sorry that I cannot get around to visit our sick at home and in the hospitals at this time. Hopefully, I'll be able to walk or at least stand up soon. Thank you for your understanding.

PIPE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

In the popular Irish song 'O Danny Boy,' old Danny is reminded that 'the pipes, the pipes are calling..." Well, OUR pipes will be FALLING soon. Experts in the plumbing business have confirmed that our pipes are in bad shape. They shouldn't be, but they are. Several leaks in different areas of the rectory and church have made it clear that this is going to continue. One veteran plumber commented that he has never seen a situation like ours – many factors could have contributed to this rare occurance – rather unfavourable factors. So, all the pipes will be replaced from copper to the less risky plastic piping. The work will be done the week of March 27-31. A crew chosen by the diocese will do the replacing of the pipes and the fixing of the ceilings and walls that will be opened to access the pipes. We will cancel any meetings in the rectory that week. Remember us ... O Danny boy, the pipes, the pipes are falling...

MARCH FOR LIFE

We are now in the month of March, but the actual "March for Life" isn't until May 11th. This is an early notice ... more to come. I'd like many to come to the March. It will cost a few bucks - a worthwhile sacrifice. Perhaps giving up some things in Lent could provide for the \$40 trip. So think about making this 'mission' trip to Ottawa. The tide is beginning to change. Hearts are being converted. People who once supported this insane acceptance of abortion are now actively involved in reversing the culture of death. Plan to come to the March if you can. It's a long day ... six hours to Ottawa and six hours back, and a healthy walk through the heart of Ottawa with thousands of others. One officer of the law policing the event remarked to me, "It's the most peaceful, polite and sensible 'protest' [not really a protest, per se] that we ever see in Ottawa." Sure it's peaceful, and we smile a lot, and we meet other good people from all over the place, but we are determined to pray and witness to the sanctity of human life. Another person remarked to me, "Marches aren't my thing." I've been going to the March since day one ... it's not my thing either. Make plans to come anyway, if you can. If my sad corpus lends to the size of the crowd, and makes an impression that Canada is moving toward life, then count me in on this one. Give it some prayerful thought. More to come.
