Famous Catholic Prayers (PART 11)

Last Tuesday (March 25) we celebrated the feast of the **Annunciation of the Lord**. The choice of this date is obvious – 9 months before Christmas. Many important teachings are derived from this dramatic moment in history. Here are a few:

- 1. The eternal Son of God became the God-man, Jesus Christ, in Mary's womb the very moment she said yes to God through the angel Gabriel. Jesus' mortal life began like ours as a one celled human which is called a zygote. All human life begins and contains its full potential at the moment of conception.
- 2. Jesus' taking on human flesh means that He is the pattern for all human life. He entered our lives so fully so as to embrace every aspect of human life, including our trials and tribulations. Though Jesus could not sin, being that He is God, He knew, felt and bled the full aspect of every sin ever committed. No one can ever say that the God-man lacked a total appreciation for human misery. Though sinless, Christ knew mortal sin's devastating effects. Conversely, no one is bound to live in sin because His saving grace can uplift out lives through the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 3. The mystery of God-with-us (the Incarnation) was introduced through the perfect yes (or 'fiat') of the perfect creature, woman and disciple Mary, our Blessed Mother. Christmas was possible because one woman made a little child her everything.

This prayer is usually prayed 3 times daily: 6am, 12noon and 6pm.


