PARENTING TIP OF THE MONTH — For many of our children Lent is a time to give something up; it becomes simply a time of self-denial. Parents need to help their children understand that Lent is really a time to connect with their baptism and the teachings of our faith — it is a time to prepare ourselves for Easter. Explain to your children that we give something up as an act of self-denial, but also to unite ourselves with the world's poor; we fast, not just from food, but from poor behaviours and actions that do not make us Christ-like; we pray, not just for ourselves, but for all those in need. Reading and talking about Jesus' passion, praying as a family, engaging together in works of charity — these are all ways that families can journey through Lent together. This Lent, help your children engage in activities and take the time to become closer to God — it will make their Easter so much more meaningful.

Lenten Practices

Good Friday: A day of fasting and abstinence

Last week we celebrated Ash Wednesday which began our season of Lent. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving in preparation for our celebrations of Easter, when Christ died and rose from the dead for our salvation. There are two days of compulsory fasting and abstinence prescribed by the Church: <u>Ash Wednesday</u> and <u>Good</u> Friday (Code of Canon Law #1251).

Fasting means eating less than normal. We are asked to eat one regular size meal and two smaller meals. Catholics between the ages of 16-60 are asked abide by this discipline.

Abstinence means abstaining from eating meat on this day. Catholics older than 14 years of age are asked to abide by this discipline.

Note: We are also encouraged to continue the traditional practice of abstaining from meat <u>every</u> Friday. As well, one should not engage in excessive entertainment throughout the Lenten Season, and most certainly not on Good Friday.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u>: I will lead the Stations of the Cross immediately following the 6:30 p.m. Mass **each Friday during Lent** (except Good Friday). One of our lay people will lead us in the stations prior to each weekday Mass.

<u>Confessions</u>: I will be hearing confessions prior to weekday Masses in the St. Luke Room.

Easter Duty: We have from Ash Wednesday until Pentecost Sunday to receive the Holy Eucharist. This, of course, means that every Catholic who has already received the Eucharist must be spiritually prepared to celebrate the mysteries of our faith in communion with the entire Church. This reminds us all of the call to conversion and that there is no sin worth hanging onto that keeps us from this unity with Christ and His Church. This means that we must make a good confession during this holy time.

I encourage everyone to try to come to Mass during the week throughout the Lenten and Easter seasons. Hopefully, we will establish the joyful habit of attending Mass whenever and wherever we possibly can. Remember as well to visit the Blessed Sacrament as often as possible. All things are passing away — but the Eternal Lord, Jesus Christ, is now and will be forever be the true joy of mankind with the Holy Spirit and Our Father in Heaven.


