Priests will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) beginning at 4:30 p.m. on **Friday, March 28<sup>th</sup> and concluding at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 29<sup>th</sup>**. There will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament during this period, as well as Stations of the Cross on Friday at 7:00 p.m., and the celebration of Mass for the Forgiveness of Sins at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, March 29th. All are welcome!

#### Famous Catholic Prayers (PART 10)

(The admission of sin and Christian hope go hand in hand...)
There tends to be an overemphasis these days on "affirming" human dispositions no matter what. We may see this in the kind of council that only acknowledges the good qualities one possesses, avoiding altogether the negative ones. This is an understandable approach toward human behavior if one considers life here on earth to be all that we have. In fact, why even talk of right and wrong if what awaits us at death's door is non-existence? — a rather hopeless position to have. "Positivism" as a philosophy of life is not the equivalent of the life lived with hope.

On the other hand, Christians and other believers to a greater or lesser extent, readily point out human frailty and sinfulness (not exclusively of course) out of a conviction that life goes on after death. Through Jesus, we learn of the love the Heavenly Father has for us and the freedom He gives us to reject or accept His offer of heaven and eternal life beyond death. The fact that we admit our sin means we have a goal to strive for, a reason to be good, a reason to resist sin and repent. Essentially those of good will desire to please God who wills to save us for a better life and deliver us from eternal misery. A repentant heart is a sign of a hopeful heart. So whenever anyone tells you that you Christians focus on sin too much (such negativity!), remind them that we only want to be more pleasing to our loving God who really exists, and who really died for us, and who really offers us a glorious afterlife. The following is a prayer said between the decades of the rosary (or any other time) that reflects what was said in the above...

#### **The Fatima Prayer**

O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to heaven, especially those most in need of Thy mercy.


