Refugee Sponsorship Update

St. Mark's is now second in line to be matched with a Syrian family. The Diocese is working hard and is keeping us updated - but we're still at least several weeks away from any news. In the meantime, we're preparing for their arrival and hope you can help.

One of our top priorities is finding temporary accommodation (for up to 6 people) for when the family first arrives – a place they can call home for up to 2 months. Affordability is important as is easy access to public transit, cooking facilities and, ideally, a private entrance. By having up to 2 months, the family will have a chance to get to know our community and help us know where they'd like to settle down. If you know of a suitable apartment or residence, please contact the parish office.

We continue to seek translators within our parish. The official language of Syria is modern Arabic. There's also a possibility that the family may be more comfortable with other dialects. If you or someone you know is fluent in Arabic, Levantine, Mesopotamian, Kurdish, Armenian or Azeri, please contact the parish office or Mike Serres at 519-744-8780 or michael.serres@bell.net.

Our collection of in-kind donations – appliances, furnishings and other household items - will begin as soon as we're matched with a family. We'll also be happy to help with the transport of larger items (such as tables and chairs). If you'd like to help with an in-kind donation, please watch the bulletin for details.

Together, our parish family has the opportunity to help a Syrian family find peace, safety, comfort and a new beginning. Thank you for your continued support!

No one more than she could understand the pains of her son who bore the sins of the world. A sword did pierce her heart, as Simeon had foretold, when she and Joseph first brought the child Jesus to the temple. Happily, of course, the woman of grace was richly rewarded for her sinless, pure and self-sacrificing life. Because she was free from original sin and not having personally sinned, she did not have to suffer the corruption of 'natural death' which is the direct result of original sin. Her 'assumption' into heaven was her unique blessing because of God's choice and her cooperation with Divine grace.

Having said the above, we must also please Mary who intercedes for us like no other mere mortal can by considering her own words in the Magnificat. There she spoke these words – "He looks on His servant in her lowliness." Our Lady happily acknowledges that all she was and is resulted from God's goodness. This is a particularly attractive feature of Our Lady. She directed all glory and praise to the Holy Trinity. Mary, more than anyone else, knows that by loving her and admiring her beauty means that we all the more glorify and praise the one who made her to be who she is. In other words, how beautiful must be our creator for having made such a beautiful creature as she. As the poet William Wordsworth said, "Mary is nature's solitary boast."
