Refugee Sponsorship Update

St. Mark's is now FIRST in line to be matched with a Syrian family. The diocese is working hard and is keeping us updated – but we're still likely several weeks away from any news. In the meantime, we're preparing for their arrival and hope you can help.

One of our top priorities is finding temporary accommodation (for up to 6 people) for when the family first arrives – a place they can call home for up to 2 months. Affordability is important as is easy access to public transit, cooking facilities and, ideally, a private entrance. By having up to 2 months, the family will have a chance to get to know our community and help us know where they'd like to settle down. If you know of a suitable apartment or residence, please contact the parish office.

We continue to seek translators within our parish. The official language of Syria is modern Arabic. There's also a possibility that the family may be more comfortable with other dialects. If you or someone you know is fluent in Arabic, Levantine, Mesopotamian, Kurdish, Armenian or Azeri, please contact the parish office or Mike Serres at 519-744-8780 or michael.serres@bell.net.

Our collection of in-kind donations – appliances, furnishings and other household items – will begin as soon as we're matched with a family. We'll also be happy to help with the transport of larger items (such as tables and chairs). If you'd like to help with an in-kind donation, please watch the bulletin for details.

Together, our parish family has the opportunity to help a Syrian family find peace, safety, comfort and a new beginning. Thank you for your continued support!
