**St. Andrew** was a native of Bethsaida in Galilee, a fisherman by trade, and a former disciple of John the Baptist. He was the one who introduced his brother Peter to Jesus, saying, "We have found the Messiah." Overshadowed henceforth by his brother, Andrew nevertheless appears again in the Gospels as introducing souls to Christ. After Pentecost, Andrew took up the apostolate on a much wider scale, and is said to have been martyred at Patras in southern Greece on a cross, which was in the form of an "X". This type of cross has long been known as "St. Andrew's cross." He is the patron saint of fishermen.

The last Sunday of the Liturgical Year always ends with the Solemnity of Christ the King. In the Church, there are 3 main orders of celebrations, with the highest being a solemnity. Some solemnities include Christmas, Corpus Christi, Sacred Heart, Trinity Sunday, Pentecost, St. Peter and St. Paul; and there are three to Mother Mary – Mother of God, Assumption and Immaculate Conception. Next are Feast days and Memorial days, in that order, that normally commemorate the saints or some Feasts of Our Lord, such as the Triumph of the Cross. Today's Solemnity of Christ the King is a relatively recent addition to the Western liturgical calendar, having been instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI for the Roman Catholic Church. In 1970 its Roman Catholic observance was moved to the final Sunday of Ordinary Time from the last Sunday in October. Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King in his encyclical letter Quas primas of 1925, in response to growing secularism. According to Cyril of Alexandria, "Christ has dominion over all creatures, ...by essence and by nature." His kingship is founded upon the hypostatic union. "... The Word of God, as consubstantial with the Father, has all things in common with him, and therefore has necessarily supreme and absolute dominion over all things created." The feast has an eschatological dimension pointing to the end of time when the kingdom of Jesus will be established in all its fullness to the ends of the earth. It also leads into Advent, when the Church commemorates the arrival of the newborn king.

Grant, O Lord, to Your Church assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give tranquility of order to all nations; make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation; to it be glory and honor for ever. Amen.

## **Candidates Preparing for the Sacraments** of First Eucharist or Confirmation


