PLEASE NOTE <u>NEW</u> MASS TIME:

The Tuesday evening Mass moves to 12 noon beginning Nov. 9th.

The feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran marks the dedication of the cathedral church of Rome by Pope Sylvester I in 324. This church is the cathedra (or chair) of the bishop of Rome, who is the Pope. A Latin inscription in the Church reads: "omnium ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis mater et caput." Translated, this means, "The mother and head of all churches of the city and of the world."

Pope Saint Leo I, known as "St. Leo the Great," was Pope during the 4th ecumenical council that helped prevent the spread of error on Christ's divine and human natures. He also intervened for the safety of the Church in the West as well, persuading Attila the Hun to turn back from Rome. As early as 445, Leo had intervened in this dispute in the East, which threatened to split the churches of Alexandria and Constantinople, leading to the present-day split between Eastern Orthodoxy.

St. Martin of Tours left his post in the Roman army to become a "soldier of Christ" as a monk and later bishop. Born in the year 316 in modern-day Hungary, Martin stopped and cut his own cloak into two halves with his sword, giving one half to a freezing beggar. That night, the unbaptized soldier saw Christ in a dream, wearing the half-cloak he had given to the poor man. Jesus declared: "Martin, a catechumen, has clothed me with this garment."

Josaphat Kuncewitcz was born about the year 1580 and given the name John at baptism. He was born in the then-Polish region of Lithuania of Orthodox parents and eventually became a Catholic and Ukrainian Basilian monk. Chosen bishop, he worked faithfully for the unity of the Church until he suffered martyrdom at the hands of an angry mob in Russia.

The context for today's Gospel continues to be mounting tension between Jesus and the Jewish authorities. Mark reports some of Jesus' teaching in the Temple area in today's reading and in the preceding verses not included in our Lectionary sequence. In the first part of today's Gospel, we hear Jesus warn the crowds not to follow the example of the scribes in seeking honor and attention from others. It is important to recall that Mark indicates that Jesus taught these things while in the vicinity of the Temple in Jerusalem. Mark is setting the stage for Jesus' passion. Jesus then observes how Jewish pilgrims are making their contributions to the temple treasury. The Temple in Jerusalem was the center of Jewish worship in the time of Jesus. It was expected that observant Jews would make pilgrimages to the Temple to offer prayer and sacrifices. Pilgrims were also expected to make a financial contribution to the temple treasury.

As we would expect to be the case, Jesus observes that those who were rich contributed large sums to the treasury. Those with less means made smaller contributions. A similar situation exists in most of our parishes as well. Jesus calls attention, however, to a poor widow who makes the smallest of contributions—two coins of little value. Jesus upholds the poor widow's offering for his disciples' consideration, commending her because her small offering was an act of profound generosity, giving from her livelihood rather than her surplus.

To give from our livelihood is not only an act of generosity, it is also an act of trust in God. We can only give from our need if we trust that God will provide for us. Jesus himself demonstrates the ultimate act of generosity and trust in God as he gives his life for us on the cross.

We are, therefore, reminded to pray for our beloved dead to assist them in attaining heaven.

Reflection

Patris Corde, 6 (Apostolic Letter by Pope Francis, 2020)

Working persons, whatever their job may be, are cooperating with God himself, and in some way become creators of the world around us. The crisis of our time, which is economic, social, cultural and spiritual, can serve as a summons for all of us to rediscover the value, the importance and necessity of work for bringing about a new "normal" from which no one is excluded.
