Baseball and Religion?

Baseball is not a bulletin topic, but so many are talking it up due in large part to the Blue Jays playoffs run – now might be the time to bring the game into the sphere of religion. The following may be stretching it a bit, but baseball has some inbuilt religious dimensions to it. Here are some "for instances..."

- The sacrifice bunt is intended to "give oneself up" for the team. Certainly, this is at the heart of gospel living – self sacrifice.
- In baseball there are clear lines between fair and foul, safe and out. We want clarity as to our eternal destiny, what makes us safe, what keeps us out. Clarity isn't always easy to take but better that we know even if it makes us uncomfortable.
- The objective of baseball is to get home safe. This is not accomplished by running carelessly or in a haphazard way. One has to go to first, then second, then third base before getting home. The fundamental bases we must touch to get home safely, i.e. to heaven, are faith, hope and charity. One cannot avoid touching these bases.
- Bullpen specialists come in to 'save' a game, and they dare not blow a 'save.' We do not want to blow an opportunity to assist in the work of the church, which is to save souls.
- Baseball is the only major sport not governed by a time clock, like hockey, football, soccer, basketball, etc. It goes on indefinitely until the 'last out' is recorded. The Lord gave us no time clock as to when it will all be over. "You'll know not the hour, nor the day." Just be ready when the last play is recorded.
- Of course, the Good Book declares the magnanimous work of the Creator that took place, "in-the-big-inning." We need big innings in our lives and new beginnings when God calls us to do great things in His name. Big-innings go a long way in securing victory.
- Baseball claims as its greatest hero a man named George Herman Ruth, dubbed the "babe" or the "bambino." Well, George found his way back to <u>The</u> Bambino who came to save us. Ruth's good friend, Paul Carey, didn't blow a save opportunity. He got Ruth to see a priest, confess and be reconciled to the Lord before he died.

What I have written is not good theology, per se, and for sure I'm stretching things. However, in some ways the game, like many things in life, can reflect heavenly realities. Hey, we can watch ball and think of God, too.

Yogi Berra was a great ball player, a practicing Catholic and famous for his sayings like "it ain't over till it's over." Supposedly he used to pray to God that the Yankees would win, and they usually did when Yogi played for the Yanks. Knowing this fact, a reporter asked Yogi one time when they lost a big game, "Yogi, where was God today, did He forget about you?" Yogi, defending the Lord, sharply remarked, "Come on, Mac, nobody's perfect." Yogi was a good man – not a theologian.
