On Just War...

I am sure that many of us are praying for peace. But what can be done in the face of the terror of ISIS and the like? Since we are at war, let us consider the Christian teaching on the notion of the "just war."

The first requirement of the just war is that the aggressor (e.g. ISIS) has inflicted lasting, grave and certain damage on a nation or nations. The second condition is that peaceful avenues have been explored, leaving (regrettably) no alternative but war. The third condition is that there be serious (not certain) prospects for true success. This is not about blowing off as many heads of ISIS' militants as possible – this will happen to some degree. Rather, it is stopping the onslaught of terror and securing peace and freedom for those whose lives have been torn apart. The fourth condition is that the use of arms must not produce an evil and disorder worse than the one to be eliminated. The world leaders must take to heart the concerns of people like an Iraqi priest who said "blowing our country to hell will not stop ISIS and will make our homeland virtually unlivable."

As we all pray for peace, we must commend to God all who have gone beyond the call of duty helping individual communities in the war-torn regions. I hope that well-off countries will act like Jordan and welcome the refugees of war. Pope Francis said that ISIS must be stopped (not necessarily bombed). God, provide such means for us and the willingness of many to implement these means (if they exist).

We all have our thoughts about the war. Who really knows what to do? The above principles on the just war have been formulated by people of the Gospel. They help us to make reasonable judgments. One thing we can do is judge our national and personal ideologies. Much is good and praise-worthy about western life. Still there are many glaring evils – abortion, violence, hedonism, pornography, family breakdown, etc. etc. These alone do not cause others to hate us. They do diminish the light of Christ which has the power to soften the hardest of men's hearts.
