St. John Paul II – Traditionally, the feast of a saint is celebrated on the anniversary of his/her death, the day the person left for his/her eternal abode. However, in the case of Pope John Paul II, his feast was fixed for October 22, when his pontificate was officially inaugurated. John Paul II of Poland was elected on October 16, 1978, becoming the first Slav pope and the first non-Italian pope in 455 years since Dutch Pope Adrian VI, who served from 1522 to 1523. Six days later, on October 22, he inaugurated his pontificate with a solemn High Mass in Rome's St. Peter's Square. John Paul II died on April 2, 20015, after leading the Church for over 26 years. Pope Benedict XVI beatified him on May 1, 2011, establishing October 22, the day of his inauguration, as his feast day. Three years later, Pope Francis officially declared him a saint on April 27, 2014, along with Pope John XXIII.

Jesus urges his disciples to pray and not lose heart, for God hears and answers prayers.

J = St. John Room L = St. Luke Room M = St. Matthew Room

This is the first of two parables that Jesus tells in Luke 18 about prayer. The second, about humility, will be read at Mass next Sunday This first parable is a lesson in persistence in prayer, and while the parable seems to present prayer as nagging God for what we want, such a reading misses the point.

God is <u>not</u> like the judge in the parable, worn down by requests and coerced to respond. The key is found in the description of the judge as corrupt and unjust. Since God can be neither, we must understand Jesus to be saying that if even an unjust judge responds to the persistence of the widow, how much more so will God listen to our prayers.

God truly wants to hear our needs and respond generously. It is the final lament of Jesus that gets to the point of the parable. The lesson is about the persistence of the one who prays. God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, "Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?" In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart. ■


C.W.L. News...

Feast of All Souls Commemoration of the Faithful Departed



Time is quickly approaching the month of November, in which we are called to commemorate and renew the memory of our beloved dead. Because the feast of All Souls (November 2) falls on a Saturday this year, the Mass of All Souls will be transferred to the following **Tuesday, November 5th** and Mass will be celebrated at **7:00 p.m.**

Tuesday, November 5⁻⁻ and Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m. As in the past several years, during Mass there will be a calling of the names of our dead, for whom Mass will be offered. If you would like to have the names of your deceased loved ones included, you are asked to submit their names in an envelope or phone Pam at the parish office. You may also request a candle or candles that will burn at the altar by including a \$5 donation that covers the cost of the candle. Each candle will burn for 5 days and you may leave it at the altar to remain burning or take it to your home after Mass.
