Solemnity of All Saints is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1st. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints – that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church. The holy day was eventually established on November 1st by Pope Gregory III in the mid-eighth century as a day dedicated to the saints and their relics.

All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go. Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32. "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... Thus made atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin." Consistent with these teachings and traditions, Catholics believe that through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the proud Pharisee who prayed from his self-importance and the tax

collector who prayed humbly.

The second parable that Jesus tells in Luke 18 addresses attitude in prayer. In contrasting the prayer of the Pharisee with the prayer of the tax collector, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray in humility before God. Jesus again surprises his listeners by showing the tax collector as the example of faith, rather than the Pharisee.

Remember the Sadducee's and Pharisee were two main religious groups at the time of Jesus. The Sadducees, a more elite and politically influenced group, disappeared when the temple in Jerusalem was destroyed in 70 A.D. and, therefore, no longer exists. The other group, the Pharisees, were in existence since the 2nd century B.C. and claimed Mosaic authority for their interpretation of Jewish Laws and religious piety; while the Sadducees represented the authority of the priestly privileges. After the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 AD, Pharisaic beliefs became the foundational, liturgical and ritualistic basis for Rabbinic Judaism. The current day Orthodox stream of Judaism in Israel and elsewhere, is in fact a continuation of the Pharisees' interpretation of Judaism. Most religious Jews in Israel are Orthodox, but there are other streams of Judaism in there too, like the Reformed Judaism, who do not follow Orthodoxy, and thus are not following the kind of Judaism that evolved from the Pharisees. If anyone, therefore, would be a model for prayer, a Pharisee was a likely candidate.

In contrast, Jesus offers the tax collector as a model for prayer. Tax collectors were collaborators with the Roman authorities in a system that allowed the tax collectors to line their own pockets by charging in excess of the defined taxes. Yet, remembering that the purpose of a parable is to make an important moral lesson, in this parable, Jesus offers the humility of the tax collector as a model for the prayer of a disciple. The parable reminds us that when we pray, we must remember our need for God in our lives. If we are too full of ourselves, there is too little room for God's grace to work in us.

If you would like to request a candle to burn in their memory, please include a \$5 offering for each candle you request. These will be 5-day candles that you may take home at the end of Mass or leave for them to continue to burn in the church.
