A note from Fr. Don...

I was in Ithaca, New York this summer visiting family. In the town square even outdoor smoking is prohibited because of the crowds and the number of children present. So, that's good – no problem. At the same time, a huge poster is visible advertising the "services" of Planned Parenthood [P.P.]. This outfit is dedicated to horrible things including the killing of the unborn child. P.P. has an "ideal" they call "pro-choice." On the one hand, smoking is prohibited in the square to protect the young. On the other hand, in the name of "freedom," P.P. is advertised so that expectant mothers might be deceived into thinking that abortion would be a satisfying option for them. What a gross contradiction!

Adolf Hitler had an idea of the "super race," which included the notion that "undesirables" could be "eliminated" in order to advance this "ideal." A former soldier in the German army during Hitler's reign told me that the great shame of his nation was that the silent majority did or said little (likely out of fear) to oppose Hitler until the full horror of his plan was revealed – by then it was too late. (The above was his assessment of the situation – he was there, I wasn't.)

To be sure, an unborn child is a gift from God, a real human being and infinitely more important that the "ideal" that has come to be known as "pro-choice." For us, it is truly inexcusable to say or do nothing to oppose abortion out of deference to a bogus "right to choose" philosophy which supports the killing of unborn human life once we deem the life to be "undesirable." Hearts are being changed, but only because of voices that speak out for life and bear witness to it. We hope and pray that one day soon the "legal" assault against the unborn will be, in a way, like Dachau or Auschwitz – a memory of a past horror that is never to be repeated.

Pope Francis has recently urged people who have sinned in the above way to come back to the Sacrament of Confession and receive the infinite mercy of God. There is no doubt in my mind that many (if not most) women would never have had an abortion had they had a culture of life to support them in their time of distress.
