TWENTY-FOURTH WEEK OF ORDINARY TIME

God's loving mercy and forgiveness to us is the central message in **Luke's Gospel** for the **24th Sunday of Ordinary Time**. Knowing that his audience includes not only the sinners but also the judgmental religious leaders, Jesus offers three parables about mercy, ending with the powerful story of the Prodigal Son. The father says to the jealous older son, "You are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found."

Tuesday is the **Memorial of Saint John Chrysostom**, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Wednesday has its own readings with the **Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross**. Thursday is the **Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows** and Friday the **Memorial of Saints Cornelius, Pope, and Cyprian**, Bishop, Martyrs.

In our first reading, Paul's wonderful **First Letter to the Corinthians** continues to feed us with powerful messages about good community behavior, the Eucharist and the mystery of the Resurrection.

We experience more of the beauty of **Luke's Gospel** this week. Jesus heals the slave of a Roman officer, praising the officer's faith. He encounters a widow whose only son had died. "He was moved with pity" and raises the son from the dead. Jesus tells the people how inconsistent their responses are. At a dinner, Jesus encounters a weeping, sinful woman who washes his feet with her tears. "So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven; hence, she has shown great love." We hear that Jesus is accompanied by a group of women "who provided for them out of their resources." Jesus tells the parable of the sower to a large crowd of listeners. and breaks it open for his disciples.

Thank you to all who participated in the initial stage of the preparation for the Synod of Bishops, which will take place in Rome in October 2023 on the theme of Synodality: Communion, Participation



and Mission. Over 2,000 submissions were received in the Diocese of Hamilton, including both individual and group responses. Every effort was made to include your thoughts in the Diocesan summary, which is provided here for your further reflection: https://hamiltondiocese.com/synod/.

The Canadian Conference of Bishops recently released their report on the 4 regional (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario and the West) submitted to the Vatican on August 15th, 2022 (https://www.cccb.ca/media-release/the-cccb-submits-its-national-synod-synthesis-to-the-holy-see/). So from Hamilton (diocese) to Ontario (region) to Canada (country) we have three reports for those interested in what the 'people of God' are sharing with each other, as 'Church with the Holy Spirit'.

We are now in the 'continental' stage that will conclude early October. This stage has an 'aim of formulating open questions more accurately, and to better substantiate and flesh out the insights coming from the local Churches, now at a continental perspective.' NOTE: 'Continent' does not correspond with the 5 continents (Americas, Africa, Asia, Europe and Oceania); rather two components: 1) That expressed by the 5 International Meetings of Episcopal Conferences (indicated in brackets), corresponding roughly to the five continents: Europe (CCEE), Latin America and the Caribbean (CELAM), Africa and Madagascar (SECAM), Asia (FABC) and Oceania (FCBCO). 2) North America (USA+Canada) and the Middle East (which will specifically see the contribution of the Eastern Catholic Churches).
