**Guardian Angels** – The concept of an angel assigned to guide and nurture each human being is a development of Catholic doctrine and piety based on Scripture but not directly drawn from it. Jesus' words in Matthew 18:10 best support the belief: "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father." A feast in honor of the guardian angels was first observed in the 16th century. In 1615, Pope Paul V added it to the Roman calendar.

#### Today we continue to read from the Gospel of Mark.

Recall that last week we heard Jesus chastise his disciples for their argument about who among them was the greatest. Jesus taught them that the greatest among them will be those who serve the least ones. In today's Gospel, the disciple John questions Jesus about an unknown exorcist who was driving out demons in Jesus' name. John's question might have been motivated by jealousy. Previously in Mark's Gospel, Jesus healed a boy whom the disciples had been unable to heal. John's question is further evidence that the disciples have not yet grasped Jesus' words to them. They continue to compare themselves to others who seem to have greater healing powers, and they do not want to share the power of Jesus' name with others.

Today the demon possession described in the Gospels might be seen as a form of mental illness, but the need for healing these syndromes was as real then as it is now. Exorcism was a common practice in first-century Palestine. Some people had the power to heal the symptoms of possession. One of the strategies used was to invoke the name of a person or figure who was believed to have the power to heal.

The disciples observed that the unknown exorcist invoked Jesus' name and was successful in his healing efforts. This unknown healer recognized the power of Jesus' name, yet he was not a follower of Jesus. In his reply to his disciples, Jesus acknowledges that deeds of faith can precede the words of faith. He also teaches that the disciples should not be reluctant to share Jesus' healing powers with others.

Later in this Gospel, Jesus teaches us not to create obstacles for those who are just beginning to have faith but to encourage even the smallest signs of faith. The Greek word used here for sin also connotes "stumbling" or "causing scandal." In vivid terms Jesus teaches his disciples the consequences to those who would put obstacles before people who are on the road to faith.

# **Parish Pastoral Council**

The parish does not currently have a parish council, so over the Fall I am hoping to form one to have in place by December. The new council will be formed through the process of nomination and then election and will consist of nine people. Over the year, the parish council will meet probably five times. I invite all parishioners to take part in this process. Along with the Finance Council, the Parish Council is an important component to the parish because it helps shape and define the direction and life of the parish. **Nomination forms are available in the narthex**. You may nominate another person or yourself. Completed nomination forms may be placed in the collection basket or submitted to the office, and will be accepted until Thanksgiving Weekend, October 7<sup>th</sup>. Ballot forms will be made available on October 13/14 with (standing) names of people nominated for parish council. Based on the number of nominations, eight names will be present on the ballot. Elections will take place before/after Mass on October 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. Only people nominated and wishing to have their names standing will appear on the ballot. If you are away the weekend of the elections, you may vote through the office.

Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada: thank you for your contribution and solidarity! Following the encouragement of Pope Pius XII, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) was established in 1943 under the name Canadian Catholic Conference and officially recognized by the Holy See in 1948. Following the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), it became part of the worldwide network of episcopal conferences. As the CCCB President states in his message for the Collection, "Through their Episcopal Conference, the Bishops today continue to work together on doctrinal and ethical guestions; ecumenical initiatives and interreligious dialogue; international relations; evangelization, faith education and catechesis; relations with Indigenous peoples; questions of social justice, and the development of a culture of life and family." In addition to their national Conference, the Bishops of Canada also meet in four Regional Assemblies (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario and the West). The CCCB as well as the regional assemblies include the Bishops of the Latin Church in Canada together with the Eparchial Bishops of the Eastern Catholic Churches.
