## FUTURE USE OF CURRENT FACILITIES

The Diocese of Hamilton and the Town of Halton Hills have reached agreement on the terms of a lease which would allow our current church and rectory to be used as a temporary location for the Halton Hills Library. The lease will be approximately 18 months - for the duration of the Library's renovation project. The Library will make various improvements to the facilities - primarily the Hall - which will include carpeting, painting, air conditioning - all of which will enhance the value of the facility for its eventual sale. It is the intention of the Diocese to sell the property and buildings to an appropriate buyer. The proceeds of the lease and the eventual sale follow our parish and will be used toward the mortgage of our new church. The Library will occupy the Hall and use the church for offices and conference areas. We will have an opportunity to remove religious symbols and pews prior to the Library moving in sometime in the winter of 2011 - after we have moved to our new parish home.

## DIOCESAN "YEAR OF THE FAMILY"

His Excellency, the Most Reverend Anthony F. Tonnos, Bishop of Hamilton, has designated the coming year as the "Diocesan Year of the Family." This celebration of family life will begin on the Feast of the Holy Family (Sunday, December 27<sup>th</sup>, 2009) and conclude on the same feast day in 2010. The *Office of Family, Ministry, and Religious Education* is planning several events for the coming year, culminating with a Diocesan family weekend in October. More details of the year will be announced as they unfold. The Bishop will offer a Pastoral Letter on the Feast of the Holy Family as a way to inaugurate the year.

Happily, this diocesan "Year of the Family" overlaps with the universal Church's observance of the Year for Priests which concludes on June 19, 2010. Priests come from families! Parents, grandparents, uncles, aunts, cousins and siblings are encouraged to pray for and support vocations to the Diocesan priesthood and religious life. Please also pray for all bishops and priests in ministry now that they may continue to grow in holiness and joy in their vocation.

Christmas is a perfect time to help your children remember what the 'reason for the season' actually is – the birth of Jesus Christ. Read the story of the Nativity together, let your children help set up the Manger in your home, take part in your parish Christmas pageant where possible and before opening gifts Christmas morning, sing 'Happy Birthday' to Jesus.
