From the Pastor's Desk

This Sunday's gospel recounts the moving story of a man with Leprosy approaching Jesus, asking for healing. Having leprosy was a life sentence of social isolation. The law prevented you from going near anyone because the disease was thought to be very contagious. This is what makes this encounter so provocative - not only does the leper approach Jesus, but Jesus allows him to! Everyone around him would have been shocked! The man humbly says, "Jesus, if you choose, you can make me clean." Jesus shows compassion and responds, "I do choose. Be made clean." It's a good reminder for us that there is nothing we can't bring to Jesus, even our darkest, most shameful sins. As we approach Lent, make a point of receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Bring all the messiness of your life to the Lord so that we may know his mercy and love. Because when we approach with humility, he always chooses to make us clean!

Wed, Feb 14th - Ash Wednesday

Lent begins this year on Wed, Feb 14th as we commemorate Ash Wednesday. We will have two Masses that day at **9:00am** and **7:00pm** as well as liturgies in each of our parish schools. Be sure to join us on this solemn day as we begin our Lenten journey!

ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT

Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of *universal fasting* and abstinence from meat for Catholics. The rules for abstaining from meat are simple. All Catholics, 14 years of age and older, may not eat meat on Ash Wednesday or Good Friday as a sign of penance. One may choose to abstain from meat on Fridays throughout the year or perform some act of charity in place of abstinence.

Fasting from food applies to Catholics, in good health, who are between the ages of 18 and 59 years of age. A fast may simply mean eating less food at the times of day we normally eat.

Christian fasting obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open for prayer, to share more in the suffering of those who are starving and to save money to give to the poor. Fasting among Christians is a penitential discipline intended to open our hearts to God and others, a means of purification and spiritual liberation, a witness of the depth of our faith.

Stations of the Cross - Friday Evenings

The Stations of the Cross will begin at 7:00 p.m. on Fridays during Lent. The Stations of the Cross provide an opportunity to reflect on the depth of God's self-sacrificing love, to join our sufferings to those of Jesus and to become more sensitive to the needs of those around us. This is a wonderful Lenten devotion for individuals and families.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

During the penitential Season of Lent, I encourage you to make your peace with God in this graced encounter with the Father of all mercies. Pope Francis so beautifully reminds us: "Whenever we take a step towards Jesus, we come to realize that He is already there, waiting for us with open arms...How good it feels to come back to Him whenever we are lost! Let me say once more: God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking His mercy." There are opportunities for the sacrament of Reconciliation on Tuesdays from 6:00 - 6:30 p.m. and on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:30 p.m. In addition, a Lenten Day of Penance will take place on Saturday, March 16th from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Her Heart Matters - wear red on February 13

According to the Canadian Women's Heart Health Centre, heart disease used to be considered a "man's disease", but no longer. While heart disease is on the decline among men, it is rising among women, it is the number one killer of women worldwide, and the leading cause of premature death in women in Canada. Much of what we know about the diagnosis and treatment of heart disease is based on research in men, but women's hearts and the way they experience heart disease are different in many ways. Women generally have higher heart rates and smaller hearts and arteries than men. While male hormones enlarge arteries, female hormones make them smaller, making women's arteries more prone to blood clots or blockages and more difficult to repair.
