

Sacramental Information

Baptism - Infants and young children of parishioners are baptized on Sunday afternoons, except during the Season of Lent. Adults requesting baptism, or the other sacraments of initiation should inquire about the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). Contact the Parish Office for more information.

Marriage - Weddings for parishioners are generally celebrated on Saturday afternoons. Kindly contact the Pastor a minimum of one year before the desired date of marriage. Preparation is provided in the Parish.

Sacrament of the Sick - Visits to the sick, either at home or in hospital, can be made by contacting the Parish Office. Arrangements can be made for the *Sacrament of the Sick* and for *Holy Communion*. If you are admitted to the Georgetown Hospital please be sure to identify yourself as a "Catholic" at the time of admission.

New 2012 calendars are available free of charge after Masses today. These calendars have been provided in support of *Catholic Missions in Canada*. Did you know that vast parts of our country are still considered "mission territory." *Catholic Missions* provides support to bishops, priests and religious living and working in some of the most remote parts of our country. It also supports church sponsored projects to assist the population of these areas.

PARISH FINANCIAL SUPPORT

All the proceeds (100%) go toward the mortgage of our new parish buildings. These funds are not subject to the annual Diocesan assessment of 11%. Your kind financial support and your contributions of time and talent help make Holy Cross the great parish that it is!

TAX RECEIPTS

Income tax receipts for donations made to Holy Cross Parish in 2011 will be mailed before the end of February. Holy Cross Parish is a Federally registered charitable organization, subject to the regulations of the Canada Revenue Agency concerning charities. All identified donations to the parish are eligible for an income tax receipt.

WEDDINGS IN 2013

Couples planning to marry at Holy Cross Parish in 2013 are invited to contact the parish office to make arrangements. We ask one year's notice of marriage in order to accommodate the various aspects of the preparation process. Those planning weddings away from Georgetown are also asked to offer one year's notice - often these weddings involve additional documentation which can take time. Catholics are encouraged to follow the Church's law regarding marriage, namely, that it takes place in a Catholic church before an ordained deacon or priest and in the presence of two witnesses.

BAPTISMS AT HOLY CROSS PARISH

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated with children when at least one parent is a Catholic. Parents and godparents are invited to take up the practice of the faith if this has been lacking. You are the "first teachers" of your children in the faith and we pray that you will be the best of teachers! For serious family reasons, permission may be given for Baptism to be celebrated in another Catholic parish, or to celebrate Baptism with families from outside our parish. Arrangements for Baptism can be made before the child is born. We ask new parents to participate in a Baptism Preparation Meeting (generally the first Thursday of each month). It would be fine to participate in this meeting before the child is born. Godparents are welcome to attend the meeting if they are able. A "godparent" is a fully initiated Roman Catholic - meaning that they are baptized, confirmed and regularly practising their Catholic faith. Baptized non-Catholics may act as a Christian Witness along with a Catholic godparent.

Thanks to the leaders & volunteers who offer *Children's Liturgy of the Word* each Sunday at the <u>9:00 a.m.</u> Mass. They will resume on Sunday, January 15th. It's not too late to sign up!

Speaking of children - what a great joy it is to have so many children and families at our parish Masses - it is a great sign of our future as a parish. Sometimes the little ones get a little excited. If this happens parents may wish to bring their child to the Narthex until they calm down. If toys are necessary - quiet and soft toys are preferred. Thanks to our parents for bringing their children to Mass ... sometimes it's a struggle, but then each stage of parenting brings its own challenges. The regular participation in Sunday Mass will help form our children as followers of the Risen Lord.
