MESSAGE FROM FATHER CULL

I wish to update you with regard to two recent meetings that have taken place. The Liturgy Committee gathered to review our celebrations for Advent and Christmas and to plan for the seasons of Lent and Easter. In reviewing our celebrations on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, I shared the fact that some people were disappointed about the early start of the 5:00 p.m Mass on Christmas Eve as they did not expect this. I apologize to anyone who was inconvenienced by the early start and will make sure next year to communicate the fact that the first Holy Mass of Christmas will most likely begin around 4:30 p.m.

Although we did not specifically discuss the effects of the recently implemented new schedule of Masses on the weekend, I am very pleased by the results, even after a rather short period of time. Prior to making the change, the Sunday 11:00 a.m. often had people standing and now with the change to 10:30 a.m. there is seating space available. I am delighted to share that attendance at the Noon Mass continues to increase and that we are welcoming almost three times as many people (and a number of new faces) in comparison to when the Mass was offered on Sunday at 7:00 p.m. Given the three Sunday morning Masses, I realize that the choirs overlap in their use of the St. Cecilia music room and I am very grateful for the spirit of cooperation.

Last week the Social Committee also had a meeting to discuss upcoming events. In addition to Eileen Anderson, Jane Santaluce and Mary Jo Jans, the committee has a number of new members: Larry and Barb Bruce, Daryll and Joanne Hillier, Katy and Dale Norton, Michelle and Dale Pyne. Together we discussed the following upcoming events: Euchre Night on Friday January 30th, Chili and Talent Night on Saturday February 28th, and a Parish Picnic on Sunday June 14th. Given the number of young families and new parishioners that we have, I feel that a picnic is a wonderful way to extend a heartfelt welcome to all. Details about these upcoming events will follow.
