CATHOLIC SCHOOL ADMISSION

Parents wanting to pre-register their children for Early Years Learning (JK & SK) may do so on January 24th and 25th in our Catholic elementary schools. To register a child in Catholic school parents must present the Catholic baptismal certificate of the child or of one of the Catholic parents. Reception of the Sacraments (First Communion or Confirmation) requires Catholic baptism or reception into the full Communion of the Catholic Church.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

Christian communities across Canada, and around the world, observe the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (January 18 - 25). The local ministerial association will sponsor a prayer service for the Christian Unity this evening at 7:00 p.m. at St. John's United Church. Christ willed that all be one. We, his disciples, are called by prayer and action to work to overcome what still divides us. There are painful divisions in the Christian family that can only be healed through prayer and humility. One area that is sometimes misunderstood is the reception of Holy Communion. For Catholics the reception of Holy Communion is a sign that the individual believes that what was bread is, through the liturgy, the Body of Christ. It is also a sign that the person receiving the Eucharist is in communion with the Catholic Church.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

All are welcome to the celebration of the Eucharist in the Catholic Church, however, only initiated Catholics, who have made their first Communion, may receive Holy Communion in the Catholic Mass. Our non-Catholic (Anglican, Lutheran, Pentecostal, United) friends are invited to join us in prayer at that sacred moment. The same applies when Catholics find themselves at a communion service in non-Catholic church. Even though there may be an invitation to the table, Catholics are asked to respect the Eucharistic discipline of the Catholic Church and not receive communion in a non-Catholic Church. We long for the day of full table fellowship when Christians will be fully unified - but we are not there yet.
