*Marriage* - Weddings for parishioners are generally celebrated on Saturday afternoons. Kindly contact the Pastor a minimum of one year before the desired date of marriage. Preparation is provided in the Parish.

*Sacrament of the Sick* - Visits to the sick, either at home or in hospital, can be made by contacting the Parish Office. Arrangements can be made for the *Sacrament of the Sick* and for *Holy Communion*. ### One Heart, One Soul Campaign – Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. Are parishes in a position to take on needed projects?

This, of course, varies from parish to parish, but in general most parishes are not in a strong position to take on major projects (those of \$250,000 or more), and many projects have

been delayed because of a lack of funding. Initially, one of the main reasons for the diocesan capital campaign was to assist parishes big and small to gain more solid footing for the future — whether that's by completing an overdue project, retiring debt, building a contingency fund or looking ahead with a new ministry or new staff. In the wake of COVID-19, parishes in the later waves of the campaign may need to use funds primarily to balance their operating budget.

## 2. What kind of financial transparency can we expect during the campaign and beyond?

Transparency is a top priority for the Diocese. Summaries of diocesan financial reports from 2012 through 2018 are on the diocesan website, and copies of the full reports are available from the Diocese's financial office. Regular updates of campaign goals, projects and fundraising will be communicated during the campaign through a number of avenues – the website, emails, social media, to name a few.

## 3. What kinds of things does the Diocese do for parishes and others already?

The good work of the Diocese of Hamilton is widespread. Here are a few examples of the ways diocesan offices enhance the life of our parishes and people:

- Advocating for the dignity of all life and supporting and promoting marriage and family life.
- Encouraging vocational discernment to priesthood and religious life.
- Programming and support for youth and young adult ministry.
- Adult faith formation, catechesis, religious education and sacramental preparation.
- Assistance in the relocation and resettlement of refugees.
- Advocacy on behalf of the poor and marginalized.
- Assistance for parishes in all aspects of sacred worship, including formation for liturgical ministers.
- Support for parishes in the areas of human resources, building maintenance, financial reporting, stewardship, charitable giving and parish development.

## <u>The Provincial Lockdown and Churches – We are Closed</u> Many of you have naturally wondered how the province-wide

lockdown announced by Premier Ford on December 21<sup>st</sup> affects Churches. The answer is that we are included in the lockdown effective December 26<sup>th</sup> at 12:01am. This means that we are closed for all public Masses until further notice. We will keep you posted through our website, Facebook and Twitter on when we are able to re-open.

#### Office is Also Closed Until Further Notice

The provincial lockdown order includes the closure of our parish office as well. Although we will still be checking messages and working, the office will be closed except for necessary in-person appointments. All other ministry will be offered by phone, email or online video conference services.

#### The Building Is Closed, But We're Still Here!

Although the building will be closed during the lockdown, that doesn't mean that we're not here! Fr. Hayden and Fr. Dave will still be celebrating Mass daily for the scheduled intentions, and for the intentions of the parish. We will still post content online including the Sunday Mass, daily Gospel Reflections, and will work to offer more ways of engaging online. Further, we will still be offering ministry by phone, and are available for emergencies to offer the Sacrament of the Sick, abiding by the protocols of our hospitals, senior homes, and emergency visits to your personal homes. The building may be closed, but the Church is never closed!
