Arrangements can be made for the *Sacrament of the Sick* and for *Holy Communion*. 

#### MARRIAGE IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

We continue a series in this week's bulletin on Catholic teaching about marriage. The text is from the Catholic Organization for Life and Family (© 2008 COLF) which is co-sponsored by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Should couples really postpone sex until they get married? We should say what we mean and mean what we say with sex. And sex says marriage. Sexual intercourse is the body language which accompanies and expresses, again and again, the wedding vows. It is the language of total gift. If one or both persons are not yet ready to say "I give all that I am, including my body" and "I accept from you the gift of all that you are, including your body", then they are not ready for sex. If a couple do not fear becoming a real gift to each other, they should not fear marriage. Sex outside of marriage is contrary to God's commandments and the clear teachings of the Bible (Exodux 20.14; Deuteronomy 5.18; Matthew 15.19; Romans 13.9; Colossians 3.5; Ephesians 5.3) and of the Christian tradition. If freely and knowingly chosen, such an act is seriously sinful. The commandments are not arbitrary. They protect what is most precious: in this case, our bodies, our sexuality, our personality, our love, our family life.

Some people fear that if they do not engage in sexual activity before marriage they will be repressed, immature or inexperienced. But as the story of Adam and Eve tells us, there is no real getting of wisdom in choosing to sin. We actually end up confused, ashamed, addicted.

The Church knows the reality of temptation. She understands human weakness. That is why, in addition to proclaiming the truth of God's will for humanity, the Church also offers the mercy of God to those who fail. Christ offered forgiveness even to the worst sexual sinners (John 8.1-11). But he also called them to *sin no more*. The Gospel always calls us to more and better. It calls us to new life. "Now the works of the flesh are plain: fornication, impurity, licentiousness … these are not the way to the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control: these are what is permitted. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires" (Galatians 5.19-24).

We are happy to welcome **Father Raymond Peter** who will speak on behalf of the Archdiocese of Visakhapatnam, India. In June we paid \$16,004.09 for our annual insurance premium for the Church and Residence. We also made interest payments of \$40,975.87 on our loans from the Diocese and RBC.

In the month of June we had 3,104 registered households, from that number 735 registered parishioners made donations through Sunday offering envelopes or pre-authorized debits. The bulk of the parish's income in June (59.15%) was donated by 23.5% of donations. In actual numbers this means that the bulk of our income was contributed by 173 donations of \$20 or more per week. Those giving under \$10 per week totalled 35.9% of all contributions. We thank all those who generously support our parish community and we encourage those who do not use offering envelopes regularly to consider doing so. All donations through offering envelopes or pre-authorized debits are given an annual receipt for income tax purposes. Parishioners who are currently giving, and are gainfully employed or have a steady income, may consider increasing the amount of their weekly donation. Even a small increase will have a big impact for the parish community.
