

The manner in which we receive Holy Communion reflects what we believe about this great mystery. The Bishops of Canada ask that just before we receive Holy Communion we make a simple bow of adoration to the Lord whom we are about to receive. When we come before the minister of Holy Communion we decide whether to receive in our hands or on our tongue. In either case we respond, aloud, "Amen" to the minister's greeting "The Body of Christ" or "The Blood of Christ."

If receiving in the hand, we stretch out our hands, making a "throne" for the King of Heaven by placing our right hand under our left. Then, after saying "Amen" we take the Sacred Host with our right hand and place it on our tongue. Please do not return to your seat carrying the Sacred Host, kindly consume in front of the minister of Holy Communion.
