

Sacramental Information

Baptism - Infants and young children of parishioners are baptized on Sunday afternoons, except during the Season of Lent. Adults requesting baptism, or the other sacraments of initiation should inquire about the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). Contact the Parish Office for more information.

Marriage - Weddings for parishioners are generally celebrated on Saturday afternoons. Kindly contact the Pastor a minimum of one year before the desired date of marriage. Preparation is provided in the Parish.

Sacrament of the Sick - Visits to the sick, either at home or in hospital, can be made by contacting the Parish Office. Arrangements can be made for the *Sacrament of the Sick* and for *Holy Communion*. If you are admitted to the Georgetown Hospital please be sure to identify yourself as a "Catholic" at the time of admission.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Today, at the 9:00 a.m. Mass, we celebrate the second *Rite* of *Scrutiny* for those who are preparing for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The second scrutiny is based on the passage from John's Gospel about the *man born blind*. In this scrutiny we pray with those to be baptized for the light of faith. Christ is the true light who illumines our lives and leads us to new life. Light helps us to see clearly those areas of our lives that are shadowed by the reality of sin. The Lord Himself forgives us and, with His light, brings us the peace and warmth of His love. The final scrutiny will take place next Sunday.

THE EASTER VIGIL

The Easter Vigil is described as the *mother of all vigils*. It is one of the most beautiful liturgies of the Church. This year we have the privilege of baptizing two adults and welcoming several Christians into the full communion of the Catholic Church. The Easter Vigil is a bit longer than a regular Sunday Mass - it unfolds the story of our salvation in Scripture, song, and ritual. The Vigil is the first Eucharist of the Easter Season. You may wish to consider attending the Vigil this year - especially if you have never attended before. Many of those who have become Catholics in previous years also attend the Vigil as a celebration of the "anniversary" of their own journey into the Catholic Church. The entire schedule for Holy Week and Easter is included with this bulletin - please plan to join us for these wonderful celebrations!
