No sin we have committed is too great for his mercy – we just need to return home to Him and we can be confident that all is forgiven! As Pope Francis has said, God never tires of showing mercy. It is too often us who tire of seeking his mercy. Let's run back into the Father's loving arms of mercy this Lent. Next Saturday, April 2nd from 10am -4:30pm is our Day of Penance. There will be priests available in the church all day to hear your confession. Just drop by anytime during that window to experience God's mercy and forgiveness!

Let me say once more: God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking His mercy." There are opportunities for the sacrament of Reconciliation on Tuesdays from 6:00 - 6:30 p.m. and on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:30 p.m. In addition, a Parish Day of Penance: Saturday, April 2nd from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with a number of priests available to celebrate the sacrament.
