

MESSAGE FROM FATHER CULL

Projector and Screens – Information Session

I am delighted that we now have a projector and screen installed in Cote Hall. On Coffee Sundays, I look forward to highlighting various community events. I also plan to use the equipment for my upcoming presentations on the teachings of Cardinal Hume this coming week. I encourage the various parish groups who gather in the hall to avail themselves of this technology.

For many months I have been praying and thinking about how I can make the proclamation of the Gospel and the

homily more engaging. While hearing the message is one thing, having some images to connect with is another way of enhancing the message. I am convinced that we need to make every effort to engage the younger generation who are very visual and conversant with social media. With the unanimous support of the Pastoral Advisory Council, I am looking at installing projectors and screens in the church. Please know that great care will be given so as to not take away from the beauty of the church. As is the case in the hall, the 2 projectors would be mounted from the ceiling and the screens would be mounted in the sanctuary area but so as not to obstruct the image of Jesus the High Priest. The screens would be operated by a remote and would only be lowered during Holy Mass as an aid to my preaching. My intention is not to bombard you with images but to offer perhaps 5 to 10 images in the course of the homily to help the message resonate more fully.

I am grateful to those who attended the presentation by Cameron Atkins of Alectro Systems Inc. last Tuesday as he talked about how the technology would be used in the church. The next step in the process is to do a sketch or photo presentation of the possible ways the projectors and screens would be placed in the church. I hope to have these on display by Coffee Sunday at the end of November and I welcome your input.

Fall Faith Enrichment Series . . . As I have done in the past, I plan to offer 2 sessions this fall to help us grow in our faith. I will be focusing on the thoughts of Cardinal Basil Hume who, until his death in 1999, was the Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster and a monk of Ampleforth

Abbey in Great Britain. I will be drawing special attention to his teachings on prayer which I think are among the best I have read. The sessions will be offered on the following dates: Tuesday November 3 at 11:00 a.m. or Wednesday November 4 at 7:00 p.m., and Tuesday November 10 at 11:00 a.m. or Wednesday November 11 at 7:00 p.m.
