The first Sunday of Advent will soon be here! One of the ways we welcome the various Liturgical Seasons, and to indicate the difference in the seasons, is to use different settings for the sung acclamations during Mass. We are fortunate at Holy Cross Parish to have an assembly who is open to learning different Mass settings and actively participating in the sung responses. So, beginning with the first Sunday of Advent, the choirs will be reintroducing the "Remembrance" Mass setting. Those of you who have been in the Parish for a while, may remember this music setting; however, the words have been updated to reflect the new translation of the Roman Missal. The choirs will be going through the various acclamations prior to Mass over the next few weeks so that you will all be familiar with the setting, and can participate fully during Mass in the Advent season. This Mass setting will be used until Lent begins, when we will return to the Creation Mass setting.
