EPISCOPAL TRANSITION

We in Hamilton Diocese are living through a brief period of transition in these weeks as Bishop Tonnos will shortly begin his retirement and we all prepare to welcome Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI who is to take canonical possession of his new Episcopal See on *Monday, November* 8th, 2010 beginning at 3:00 p.m.

This ancient rite of passage expresses and confirms our belief in the succession of bishops from "Apostolic Times" and their union in faith and fidelity with the College of Bishops and with the Pope as Bishop of Rome and Vicar of Christ on earth. A preparatory committee has been struck for this major event and is composed of Chancery staff and local pastors who will co-ordinate arrangements.

The ceremony unfolds with the first solemn entry of the new Ordinary through the doors of the Cathedral of Christ the King. He venerates a crucifix held out to him by the Rector of the Cathedral and then the Bishop sprinkles the faithful with holy water while making his way from the narthex to the sanctuary. The Metropolitan Archbishop our ecclesiastical province, His Grace, Archbishop Thomas Collins, will invite Bishop Crosby to show Pope Benedict's Letter of Appointment to the Diocesan College of Consultors. A notarised record is duly made of the fact. It is customary for the full text of the Apostolic Letter to be proclaimed aloud before the whole congregation. When these formalities have been completed Bishop Crosby will proceed to the cathedra or Episcopal Chair, which signifies his dignity and jurisdiction as our new Chief Shepherd. Form that time forth Bishop Crosby is the Bishop of Hamilton and his name will be included in the Eucharistic Prayer of every Mass in our Diocese.

This will be a day of great joy and hope for all of us who make up the local church: lay men and women, male and female Religious, deacons, and priests. Let us remember in our prayers Bishop Crosby and all those who serve us through their dedicated ministry.

Bishop Crosby's Episcopal motto is based on a phrase from the Gospel of St. John (5.44) where we read, "No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me!" The motto, "*TRAHE NOS*" in Latin which means "Draw Us". Trahe nos reminds us that it is the Lord Himself who "draws us" and inspires us to play our role in His Kingdom and to be a living and active presence in our world.
