Just a reminder that the next CWL General Meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 17 at 7:30 pm, following 7:00 pm Mass. Come out for some 'welcome back' celebrations. The Health Challenge for September is related to the

National CWL program on water conservation. Suggestions include: turning off the tap when you brush your teeth until it's time to rinse, taking shorter showers, waiting until there is a full load before using your dishwasher or washing machine, and fixing leaky taps. We're sure you have your own ideas on how to conserve water. The draw for those who participate in the monthly Health Challenge will take place at the meeting.

As you know, the CWL will celebrate its 100th anniversary in 2020. The National CWL has instituted a program called "HUG", which stands for Helping, Understanding, Giving! Women and children who seek refuge in shelters sometimes arrive with little more than the clothes on their backs. Providing a family with items of toiletries and clothing during their stay can make a big difference in helping them get back on their feet after leaving the shelter.

The HUG program is a national initiative – a fuller introduction to the program will be made at the meeting on September 17. The goal is to create and donate 2,019 parcels nationwide to commemorate the project year. In keeping with the HUG program, we are asking for members to donate toiletries at the September 17 meeting that can be used to make up parcels for women's shelters. This could include soap, shampoo, body wash, tooth brushes and toothpaste, and many other items. Full sizes or hotel-size bottles are welcome. Please be as generous as you can!

At the November General Council meeting, we will be having the election of new Executive Officers for the 2020-2021 term. We ask that you give serious consideration to putting your name forward for one of the elected officer positions of President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and Chair of Membership. Or if you are interested in something else, we are looking for Chairs for the various organizational aspects of the League.
