

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL

The successful completion of the appropriate Grade Levels is **required** prior to the child's reception of the sacraments. For example a child in Grade 2 should have completed the Level 1 program and be enrolled in Level 2. COLLECTION FOR THE NEEDS OF THE CHURCH IN CANADA: An Act of Solidarity!

This past year was marked by several pastoral projects initiated by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), including the National Week for Life and Family, which is part of the pastoral plan for life and family. The CCCB also published a number of educational materials and resources to support the work of the dioceses in teaching the faith. These include the CCCB document on the environment (*Building a New Culture: Central Themes in Recent Church Teaching on the Environment*) and the resource for helping clergy and laity to use the Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation on the Word of God (*Verbum Domini*). The CCCB also helped to coordinate the participation of over 1,000 young Canadians at World Youth Day which took place in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, during July 2013. This celebration involved Pope Francis' first apostolic visit outside Italy.

The pastoral mission of the CCCB is accomplished through love and solidarity. The Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada is being held today across Canada. We thank you in advance for your generosity, solidarity and support.

MISSION CO-OP APPEAL

Father Luis Carlos De Leon will be speaking at all Masses next weekend describing the work of and requesting support for his society, the Missionary Fraternity of Mary of Guatemala. He has been invited to our parish by the mission office of our Diocese.

Begun in 1981 as a youth ministry with seven young men, the Fraternity was subsequently established as a Society for Apostolic Life in 1990. Since then it has grown to over 150 ordained priests serving 64 missions in 31 dioceses in 11 countries. Currently there are approximately 170 seminarians in various stages of formation at the seminary in Guatemala.

Fraternity mission sites are established where there are no clergy available to fulfill pastoral needs, in difficult economic areas, and among the poor and marginalized. Fraternity priests also evangelize youth, taking young men and women on a faith journey to develop their spiritual lives and strengthen their Catholic faith to help them positively impact the community or village in which they live.
