St. Michael's Parish has been blessed with 6 adults on the journey to full initiation in the Catholic Church. It is true that it takes a parish to initiate. In the initiation process, each candidate has a sponsor. The sponsor serves as a bridge in to our community of faith.

- As a representative of the faith community, the sponsor helps the candidate feel welcome, introduces the candidate to other members of the faith community, and invites the candidate to participate in community activities.
