Fr. Martín's Corner

The Easter Vigil

Every time we say the Creed, we note that Jesus "descended into hell." Holy Saturday is the day that commemorates this event.

What happened to Jesus while he was dead?

Scripture calls the abode of the dead, to which the dead Christ went down, "hell"- Sheol in Hebrew, or Hades in Greek – because those who are there are deprived of the vision of God. Jesus did not descend into hell to deliver the damned, nor to destroy the hell of damnation, but to free the just who had gone before him.

What is the Easter Vigil? A vigil is a liturgical commemoration of a notable feast, held on the evening preceding the feast. The term comes from the Latin word *vigilia*, which means 'wakefulness', and which came to be used when the faithful stayed awake to pray and do devotional exercises in anticipation of the feast. The full meaning of the vigil is a waiting for the coming of the Lord.

What happens at the Easter Vigil? The Easter Service has four Parts:

1. The service of Light and the Easter Proclamation. The blessing of the new fire is done outside the church, whose flames should be such that they genuinely dispel the darkness and light up the night. The Paschal Candle, made of wax, is blessed to evoke the

- truth that Christ is the light of the world. The candle is the only source of light as people process into the church, just as the children of Israel were guided at night by a pillar of fire, so similarly, Christians follow the Risen Christ. "Lumen Christi!" (The Light of Christ!) is loudly proclaimed by the Deacon (or priest) as he enters the darkened church. As he chants this hopeful note, the newly consecrated burning paschal candle is raised for all to see and the people proclaim "Deo Gratias!" (Thanks be To God!)
- 2. **Liturgy of The Word** 9 Readings! 7 from the Old Testament and 2 from the New Testament. They give an account of the outstanding deeds of the history of Salvation, which the faithful are helped to meditate calmly upon by singing the Responsorial Psalm, by a silent pause and by the celebrant's prayer. After the readings from the Old Testament, "Gloria in Excelsis Deo is sung, the bells are rung, then the Collect is recited and the celebration moves on to the readings from the New Testament. The Alleluia is intoned three times before the Gospel _ the proclamation the Resurrection of The Lord.
- 3. **Liturgy of Baptism:** Whether there are candidates for baptism or not, there is a blessing of Water and the faithful are invited to renew their baptismal promises. The faithful are then sprinkled with water as a reminder of their own baptism.
- 4. **Liturgy of the Eucharist:** The Church is called to the table prepared by the Lord for His Church; a commemoration of his death and Resurrection until He comes. Highly encouraged to receive Communion on this night.

If I go for Easter Vigil Mass, do I still have to go to Mass on Easter Sunday? You are encouraged to attend them both. You will even realize that the readings are different. HOWEVER, attendance at the Easter Vigil fulfils the obligation to attend Mass on Easter Sunday. The vigil, traditionally called the "mother of all vigils", is the highlight of the celebration of Easter and indeed may be considered the principal liturgy of the Church Year.
