

Fr. Martín's Corner

The Bible

This week I would like to make a little trip through the Bible. The Bible naturally starts with the Old Testament through to the New Testament.

The Old Testament begins with the book of Genesis, which tells the story of the creation of the world. It then goes on to tell the stories of the patriarchs and matriarchs of the Hebrew people, such as Abraham, Sarah, Isaac and Jacob. The Old Testament also includes the books of Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. These books contain the laws given to the Hebrew people of God. The main character here is Moses.

From there we go to the historical books of Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1 and 2 Samuel, 1 and 2 Kings, 1 and 2 Chronicles and Ezra-Nehemiah. These books tell the story of the Hebrew people from the time they left Egypt until the time of the Babylonian Exile. From here we go to the poetic books of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and the Song of Songs. These books contain the wisdom and poetry of the Hebrew people. The Old Testament ends with the book of Malachi which prophesies the coming of the Messiah.

The New Testament begins with the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, which tell the story of Jesus Christ. It then goes on to tell the story of the early church in the Book of Acts. It includes the Epistles or letters of St. Paul, which were written to various churches that Paul had visited; as well as general Epistles or letters of James, Peter, John and Jude. The New Testament ends with the book of Revelation, which tells of the end times and the Second coming of Jesus Christ.

The Bible has had a profound impact on the world. It has shaped many civilizations and has been a comfort and inspiration to billions of people. As you can see, there is an chronological aspect on how these books are compiled. They were deliberately assembled to tell a seamless story from the beginning of Creation to the Second Coming.
