Fr. Martín's Corner



To Kneel or Stand? For a long period of time a discussion has been had about what step is best to take immediately after Holy Communion. What most of us are used to was that after Holy Communion one went back

to the pews and would kneel and say a prayer of thanksgiving. I am certain this is still common in many other places outside of Canada. But here in Canada this habit was changed at some point, and we were asked to remain standing until the Blessed

Sacrament has been reposed to the Tabernacle and then we sit or kneel after that.

The reason the standing was suggested is because we have this Eucharistic Sacrifice as a family and that being a meal, we have a collective act, when we must wait after the meal and can conclude it together as a community. There were some other theological considerations that I need to figure out and share at some point. The challenge with this was that it was not taken up everywhere; some parishes took it up while some others kept the old system of kneeling after Holy Communion. So you would find that some people remain standing while some would go and kneel right away so much so that there was no more uniformity. This is more visible when we have people visiting the parish from elsewhere.

What is the right thing to do? I think that both have been accepted by the Archdiocese and the church as legitimate ways of giving proper reverence to the Blessed Sacrament. My preference would be that we had the uniform way of doing it and my favoured way is that we would all kneel immediately after Holy Communion. This gives people more time to pray and reflect. Most times, when we wait until reposition, we do not have enough time left for the prayer before we stand for the concluding rites. Even though that is my preference I respect whichever way people to choose to do it. The Archdiocese gave us a prerogative to do it the best way we find useful. I decided to share about this because this question has lingered over the years.
