<u>New Year's Message</u> <u>from Fr. Martin:</u>

In Ancient Roman religion and myths, Janus was the god of the beginnings and transitions. He has always been depicted as having

two faces since he looked to the future and to the past. January, having been named after this deity, has the same concept. January looks ahead and sees twelve months and looks back only to see the same twelve months. This concept is very helpful to us as we thank God for having taken us through the last year and as we dedicate to Him the next year.
