# In the Parish

"Let us offer each other a sign of Christ's peace." Pastor's Message at the Beginning of the New Year



At the beginning of the New Year and on the Solemnity of Mary, our thoughts turn to peace: for the world, for our nation, for our community and within our own heart.

From a political perspective or from a secular point of view, peace is understood as "peace through strength," meaning military strength. While we have seen this notion of peace stressed in this present age, it really has existed throughout human history. During Jesus' lifetime, for example, this was the strategy of the Roman Empire: *si vis pacem para bellum* -- if you want peace, prepare for war. That peace, *Pax Romana*, lasted for some time, but at the expense of the oppression of many peoples.

As Christians, we know that the peace that Christ offers has nothing to do with military strength or the oppression of peoples. While peace means "the absence of conflict or war" at one level, it has an even more profound meaning. *Shalom* in Hebrew or in the Aramaic language of Jesus, *shlama*, has a wealth of associations not captured fully in English. It includes notions of wholeness, health and serenity as well as perfection and completion. When we offer the sign of peace to one another just before we receive the Eucharist at mass, we are wishing for the healing and health of our community; the spiritual and physical growth of one another; and a unity of mind and heart for which the world longs.

Like Mother Mary, let us ponder the meaning of the peace of Christ. And then let us offer this peace to one another in deeply meaningful ways throughout coming year.
