

New Provincial Guidelines for Religious Services

On January 3, 2022, the Province of Ontario announced a return to a modified Step 2 to reduce the spread of COVID that will take effect **starting January 5, 2022, at 12:01am** (until January 26, 2022). Among the changes it brings are:

- Indoor religious services are limited of 50% of capacity and outdoor services are to maintain physical distancing of two metres.
- Indoor meeting and event spaces, such as banquet halls and conference/convention centres, are to be closed, with limited exceptions.
- All COVID-19 protocols need to be observed including physical distancing and compliance with rules on masks (face coverings). The collecting of names and contact information is still required.

Envelopes: Envelopes for 2022 are available for pick up. If you are new to the church and would like a set of envelopes please call the parish office at 613.725.2242. St. Elizabeth church also has the option of setting up a Pre-authorized Debit plan that can be initiated by the parish office.
