Fr. Martin's Summer Message:

Churches are now open for Mass!!

We have been waiting a long time for those words! Ok, not quite fully open – but most of us can make it personally to church.

From June 30, 2021 we shall be able to accommodate 90 members at a time! Several of you had mentioned to me that you really *missed* receiving the Body of Christ in the Eucharist during this pandemic. After so many months of not being able to receive Holy Communion, what a grace that Holy Communion is once again available to everyone who is able to come to church. I, as your priest was also missing the Body of Christ but in a different way.

As priests, we are able to celebrate Mass each day and are able to receive the Body of Christ in the sacrament of Holy Communion. But personally, I have missed all of YOU as the Body of Christ, the Church, which is the people of God gathered as a Holy Communion.

I have to admit that it was emotional for me to see most of you these past few weekends. I hope that you are able to come and reconnect and try to refresh and reconstitute our community. My office (myself, Chris, and Deacon Fred) has been trying to make phone calls to all parishioners and to welcome you back and find out how you have been doing. I believe that after all this time we need to hit some kind of reset and rediscover where we are at; both in our social-psychological and spiritual life.

During this time, we lost a few parishioners, and we are still praying for them. We commend their souls to the Mercy of the Most High and we pray for their loved ones. Some have been sick. We have them on our prayer list and we remember them every day we offer the Sacrifice of the Mass. I also have had some lonely times; some sick people in my family and all sorts of news that happens when you are so far away from home. Your support and closeness to me has been my highest form of consolation. I echo the words of St. Paul: “I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now....”(Philippians. 1: 3-5)

This summer is going to be different as well. I know most of our parishioners usually like to travel during the summer and most of the usual practices have been disrupted as well. I can sympathize with that. We can only pray for the quick end of this nightmare. It appears though, that there is light at the end of the tunnel. Coming together is a good start. I hope you shall find it helpful and worthwhile to return to church after a long time on live streaming. We shall continue to live stream until we are allowed to return at 100%; bearing in mind that live streamed Masses are without the main ingredients of the Mass. I wish you a wonderful summer vacation for those who will get time to enjoy that. We continue to pray for each other. Thank you for keeping our Church alive even during the worst of times. We did it together.
