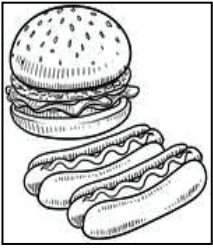

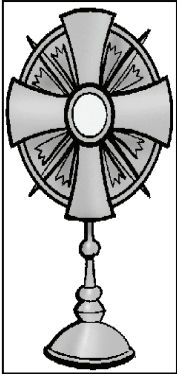
In the Parish

Fr. Martin's Corner

Brothers and sisters: Summer is upon us. School is out. Many, if not most of you have packed up and headed out for summer destinations in the sun. This, I have found out, is an annual ritual for Canadians. Aah, to relax in the sun with extended family and friends. Nothing could be nicer. Me? I have a totally different ritual from this one, but that is a story for another day!!!

Summer is a kind of Sabbath. A time to take a step back and rest and relax and take stock of what has been and what might be. A time to recharge and look inward. I am hoping that you will find this moment a very helpful one. On July 27th we shall have our annual parish barbeque. It is our time to gather as a community and break bread together. I look forward to this every year when we unite with the Feast of The Lord Community who organize the Big Give that is meant for our brothers and sisters who are less fortunate.

Next year we shall be celebrating the 60th anniversary of our church's founding. We shall be communicating the plans we will have for that day. We hope to celebrate it as a community. Needless to say, we have come of age. And right on cue, the age of our structures has begun to show. A few weeks ago, we were struck by a series of misfortunes that started with flooding in the basement. The pumps in the basement failed after being overwhelmed with so much water. As we were trying to follow that up, we discovered an even bigger problem. The pipes beneath the floor were found to have broken down and needed to change. This is in addition to the repair of the sump pumps that are used to pump the excess water outside.

As if this was not enough, we had an outstanding task of electrical repairs in the church which had been recommended to us by the evaluators. This has put us in a precarious situation in the sense that we have 3 major expenditures that have occurred at the same time and are in need of immediate attention. This is going to be our preoccupation during the summer. We are already on top of this problem and are working out a way to resolve this. We are unable to operate fully without these three problems addressed. It will without a doubt cost us much more than our budget can handle. In a very near future, I might come to you seeking for help in meeting these costs. I am less worried because every time I have come to you with a particular problem, you have always been there and ready to help. This fills me with confidence.

Our activities as a parish will continue, albeit on a smaller, slower scale. But the parish office will remain open throughout the summer, and we shall keep praying for you that everything may go well. May God bless you and let's hope that you find summertime an enriching experience.
