On Eucharistic Fasting: Something to reflect on during this Lenten season of prayer, almsgiving and fasting: the Church encourages us to "to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception of water and medication, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion (Code of Canon Law, 919)." This regulation—for those who are physically able—reflects an ancient tradition in our Church. In fact, the practice of fasting for spiritual purposes is found in nearly all religions of the world. As Roman Catholics, we believe that there are a number of spiritual reasons for fasting. One important reason is that it is an act of penance for our sins and weaknesses, and, in the process of growing closer to the Lord, we are strengthened and healed. Secondly, the fast before receiving Holy Communion creates a physical hunger and thirst, reminding us of the spiritual hunger and thirst we have for the Lord. Through our fasting, may our spiritual focus on the Lord be strengthened so that we may humbly encounter the Saviour who continually and always offers Himself to us.
