Fr. Martín's Corner



Adoration: As a young priest, we had so many meetings about what we needed to make our church grow. We always invited "experts" and motivational speakers who helped us break things down during study days and conferences. I

always wondered aloud how these good ideas would translate into the growth of the church, but we still did the same thing every year.

One time my spiritual director, a very old quiet priest told me something that kept with me. He said "without the Blessed Sacrament, all these big speeches and power point presentations are a waste of time. Go, brush off your monstrance and elevate the Blessed Sacrament, and the Lord will tell you what it is that you need to do" I have never forgotten this counsel. I have found this very helpful.

Jesus knows how to speak for Himself when we give him an opportunity. It is my hope and intention to offer our parish to the protection of Our Lord and savior Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. That is why we have the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from Tuesday to Thursday before Mass. On Fridays, we have the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 1.00 p.m. and have the Benediction at 6.00 p.m. My dream is that many of us will take a liking and interest in using this form of adoration and praise. When we collectively fall on our knees and raise our eyes to Jesus in the Sacrament, He will not fail to listen to our pleas.

We have so much to be grateful for and we have so much to pray for. The invitation is for all of us who are able to join the community in this form of praise. I remember how the during the pandemic, the availability of the Blessed Sacrament helped a lot people from all walks of life. People from all over Ottawa and the surroundings heard about us through the Real Presence. I would like you to please consider this an invitation to attend these hours offered for Adoration. My hope is that we shall even include more hours once we have more members willing to join us.
